Anthonia Ifeyinwa Achike is a Professor of Agricultural Economics, University of Nigeria, Nsukka. Also, a Senior Research Fellow at the Environment for Development (EfD) Nigeria Centre, University of Nigeria Nsukka and a global/Adjunct faculty member of the Trade Policy Training Centre in Africa (Trapca), Arusha-Tanzania. She was a visiting Professor at Michigan States University in 2017 under the USAID Feed the Future Nigeria Agricultural Policy Project. Professor Achike holds a PhD degree in Agricultural Economics, majoring in Agricultural Finance and Project Analysis with working skills in Environmental Economics and Climate Change Studies. She has attended several training courses on quantitative & qualitative data analysis, gender, poverty, policy, time management, leadership and other development issues organized by different institutions. She was a Laurette of the CODESRIA Gender Institute, Dakar - Senegal; and the Social Science Academy of Nigeria Gender Institute. She has worked as a consultant and trainer in Environmental and Social Impact Assessments, served as independent reviewer of Climate Change Policies of some States and other sub national governments in Nigeria, and has conducted many baseline evaluations, benchmarking and impact studies for various national and international organizations.

Professor Achike is currently the Director of the Gender and Development Policy Centre (GEN-CENT) of University of Nigeria Nsukka, the team leader of Nigeria's Community Based Poverty Monitoring System (CBMS-Nigeria), UNN Focal Point for the Alliance for the African Partnership (AAP) and the Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building in Agriculture (RUFORUM), and she is the Coordinator of Agribusiness Development programme of the African Network for Agriculture, Agroforestry and Natural Resources Education (ANAFE), UNN.

Professor Achike has served as the Director of the African Climate Change Adaptation Initiative, University of Nigeria Nsukka (ACCAI-UNN), the coordinator of the Transdisciplinary training for resource efficiency in climate change adaptation in Africa (TreccAfrica) of University of Nigeria Nsukka, the Coordinator of the climate change project under the African Women in Science and Technology (AWFST), a programme of the African Technology Policy Studies (ATPS), the Head of Department of Agricultural Economics University of Nigeria Nsukka and the President of University Women's Association, University of Nigeria Nsukka

Prof (Mrs.) Achike has more than eighty publications to her credit comprising journal articles, conference proceeding and technical reports.
